Saint Valentine



Saint Valentine, officially known as Saint Valentine of Rome, is a third century Roman saint widely celebrated on February 14. Although

not much of Saint Valentine's life is reliably known and whether or not the stories involve two different saints by the same name is also not officially decided, it is highly agreed that Saint Valentine was martyred and then buried on the Via Flamina to the north of Rome.

One common story about Saint Valentine is that in one point in his life, as the former Bishop of Terni, he was on house arrest with Judge Asterius. While discussing religion and faith with the judge, Valentine pledged the validity of Jesus. The judge immediately put him and his faith to the test. Saint Valentine was presented with the judge's blind daughter and told to restore her sight. If he succeeded, the judge vowed to do anything for him. Valentine, placing his hands onto her eyes, restored the child's vision. Judge Asterius was obeyed Valentine's humbled and requests. He broke all the idols around his house, fasted for three days, and became baptized along with his family and 44 members of his household. The newly faithful judge then freed all of his Christian inmates.

Saint Valentine was later arrested again for continuing to try to convert people to Christianity. The story tells that Valentine was imprisoned for marrying Christian couples so husbands wouldn't have to go to war, and aiding Christians being persecuted by Claudius in Rome. A relationship between the saint and emperor began to grow until Valentine attempted to convince Claudius of Christianity. and Claudius became enraged sentenced him to death commanding him to renounce his faith. He refused and was executed on February 14. 269. On the day of his execution, he left the judge's cured daughter a note which he signed, "Your Valentine."

Saint Valentine is the Patron Saint of engaged couples, happy marriages, love, lovers, bee keeping, epilepsy, fainting, travelers, and young people. He is represented in pictures with birds and roses, and his Feast Day is February 14.

On January 1, 2017, the second chance drawing from the 2016 lottery calendars was held. Congratulations to Jim Lokay JR, the lucky \$100 winner and Joe Jurnock the \$100 seller. During 2016, 196 lottery calendars were sold and there were 76 winners. Several parishioners donated their winnings to the church and one member bought three lottery calendars in the church's name that resulted in three winning numbers. The cost of printing the calendars, envelopes and stamps were also donated increasing our profit. Starting with a balance of \$789.90 plus \$4,900.00 calendar sales and \$250.00 in donations minus a payout of \$2,075.00 resulted in a profit of \$3,800 donated to the church and a starting balance of \$64.90 in the account for 2017. Although the number of calendar sales continues to decrease, this fundraiser remains only behind the Spring and Fall Bazaars in profit.

Chocolate-Cherry Snowballs

1 cup butter, softened $\frac{1}{2}$ cup powdered sugar

- ¹/₂ teaspoon almond extract
- 2 cups all-purpose flour

¹/₄ teaspoon salt

1 cup (8 oz) candied cherries, finely chopped

¹/₂ cup powdered sugar

1/2 cup dark chocolate chips

- Heat oven to 400°F. In large bowl, beat butter with electric mixer on medium speed until fluffy. Gradually beat in 1/2 cup powdered sugar until light and fluffy. Stir in almond extract. In medium bowl, mix flour and salt. On low speed, beat flour mixture into butter mixture until well blended. Stir in cherries.
- 2. Shape dough into 1-inch balls. On ungreased cookie sheet, place balls 2 inches apart.
- Bake 9 to 11 minutes or until edges just begin to brown. Cool slightly. Measure 1/2 cup powdered sugar into small bowl. Roll each cookie in powdered sugar. Place on cooling rack to cool completely.
- 4. Place chocolate chips in small resealable freezer plastic bag. Microwave on High 45 to 60 seconds, turning bag over every 20 seconds. Squeeze bag until chips are melted and smooth. Cut small tip off one corner of bag, and drizzle over cooled cookies. Let stand at room temperature at least 30 minutes until chocolate hardens before storing.

This easy to make recipe makes a nice Valentine's Day treat.
