Mary (Zielinsky) Soltysiak. He had 3 brothers, Anthony, Charles, and Peter Josephine sisters, and 2 and Veronica. John grew up in Bethlehem with his grandmother. When he was 16 he went to live with his family in Middleport and never did graduate from high school which was a big disappointment to him. He was put to work deliverina coal. He also started amateur boxing to earn extra money. He fought under the name "Johnny Lynch" and retired from boxing, undefeated after his marriage.

John married Mary Wadolny on July 23, 1941 and they celebrated 68 years together. They met at a Polish dance in Bethlehem. John was in a boxing event in Allentown and went to Bethlehem to visit his grandmother. After meeting Mary, he never returned to his home town of Middleport. They had one son, John S. (Salty) Soltysiak, 2 grandsons, 8 great grandchildren, 3 great great grandsons and several nieces and nephews. After he was married he was employed by the Bethlehem Steel working as a machine operator in the Drop Forge Department and the # 8 Machine Shop.

John played the violin and loved classical music. He enjoyed making wine, walking, fishing, and watching sports. As he got older he read every day about all kinds of health issues. In his 70's he started healthy cooking. A great animal lover he enjoyed helping animals that were hurt or hungry. As president of the church council he guided the construction of the new church building. He helped his wife cook the onions for pierogies, and helped her run the 20-20 club. John died at Hospice of Saucon Valley on October 20, 2009.

Together John and Mary were a great team and a great inspiration to the other members of the parish.

Blueberry Crumb Coffeecake

2 cups sugar 2/3 cup salad oil 2 eggs 3 cups flour 4 tsp. baking powder 1 cup milk 1pt. fresh blueberries

Mix sugar and eggs. Add oil, then dry ingredients and milk. Fold in blueberries. Pour in 9x11x2 pan. Cover with crumbs. Bake at 350 degrees for 50-60 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean.

Crumbs: 1/2 cup sugar 3/4 cup flour 1/3 cup butter Using 2 knives cut butter into flour and sugar to make crumbs Coffeecake was a favorite of John Soltysiak.
