40th Anniversary



After nearly 50 years at the 5th and Williams location the members of Our Lord's Ascension Parish decided that it was the right time to build a new church. Ideally, the committee hoped to find land that was situated between Allentown and Bethlehem because of the large number of members that lived in the Allentown area. The growing parish considered several locations before choosing the Jennings Street property.

In August, 1975 members gathered on the property for the ceremonial first shovel of dirt unearthed. The building process lasted less than a year. The Dedication of the New Church was held May 23, 1976. Father Walter Poposki celebrated the first mass with many clergy and local dignitaries present in the overflowing crowd. A celebratory buffet dinner was held after mass in the church hall.

The members of the A.N.S. thought that a 40th anniversary deserved some recognition. They decided to celebrate the event with a brunch after mass. They invited all members of the parish to join them for a ham and cheese quiche, zrazi, tossed salad, bread, fruit salad with dip and a chocolate-strawberry cake buffet. We Andrea Gritman. Less-Known Saints

We begin our series of less- known saints with Saint Aaron for two reasons. Alphabetically he would be first on any list of saints and his feast day is June 21st.

Saint Aaron



Aaron was brought up in a Christian family in the midsixth century. He decided one day to move by himself

to a deserted, tiny island close to his home in France. Saint Aaron believed that a life cut off from the outside world would be the best way to devote his life to God. Aaron actually succeeded in living his secluded lifestyle for a period of time, until people in France began to hear of his ways and became interested and wanted to join him. Saint Malo was the first person to go see Aaron and ultimately became his student. Soon after great numbers of men came to join Aaron and Malo which led to the building of a monastery. Not long after the building of the monastery, Aaron died. The island bore his name for a long time after he passed away as a tribute to him. Aaron was canonized "precongregation." This means that Aaron was made a saint before the time of the present day church and its setup for sainthood.

Saint Aaron is the patron saint of anybody who lives a passionate and steadfast life. Therefore, a Saint Aaron medal is a traditional communion or confirmation gift.

Lazy Dazy Cake

Ingredients

- 4 eggs
- 2 cups sugar
- 2 cups flour
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 cup scalded milk
- 2 tablespoons butter

Topping

- 3/4 cup brown sugar
- 4 tablespoons butter
- 4 tablespoons milk
- 1 cup coconut

Beat eggs until light, add sugar, flour and baking powder. Boil milk and butter: add to batter.

Pour into a greased 13-in. x 9-in. baking pan. Bake at 350° for 25-30 minutes or until a toothpick inserted near the center comes out clean.

Topping

Mix all ingredients in saucepan and spread on hot cake. Broil 2 to 3 minutes or until brown.
