Lesser Know Saints

Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini



Saint Frances was born in Lombardi, Italy in 1850, one of thirteen children. At eighteen, she desired to become a Nun, but poor health stood in

her way. She helped her parents until their death, and then worked on a farm with her brothers and sisters.

One day a priest asked her to teach in a girls' school and she held this position for six years. At the request of her Bishop, she founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart to care for poor children in schools and hospitals. Then at the urging of Pope Leo XIII she came to the United States with six nuns in 1889 to work among the Italian immigrants and became an American citizen.

Filled with a deep trust in God and with wonderful endowed а administrative ability, this remarkable founded schools, woman soon hospitals, and orphanages in this strange land for these Italian immigrants and children and saw them flourish in their new home. At the time of her death in Chicago. Illinois on December 22, 1917 her institute numbered houses in England, France, Spain, and the United States, and South America. In 1946, she became the first American citizen to be canonized when she was elevated to sainthood by Pope Pius XII.

Her feast day is November 13 and became known as the patroness of immigrants.

November is the time to be thankful, a time to remember and to embrace those who enrich our lives.

Diocesan Synod

The 12th Diocesan Synod of the Central Diocese of the Polish National Catholic Church took place October 6-8, 2006 at the Transfiguration of Our Lord Parish PNCC in Wallington, NJ. The theme of the Synod was 'Walking with Jesus," guided by the word of God, enlightened by the Principles of Bishop Hodur.

Attending were Father Bogdan and Nancy Poposki representing Our Lord's Ascension PNCC. Many topics were discussed from the Central Diocese Treasurer's Report, the importance of dues and obligations, membership, to the future direction of the church. After a successful meeting the Diocesan Synod concluded at noon on October 8th.

Sausage Stuffing

Cook up 1/2 lb of breakfast sausage and put to the side Spray 1 bag of bread cubes with Pam with butter and then toss in a bowl with:

salt and pepper (lots of it) 1 tablespoon dried thyme 1/2 tablespoon dried sage 1 teaspoon dried rosemary



Melt 1/2 stick of unsalted butter in a pan cook over medium high heat until foam subsides and cook:

1 cup sliced onions

1 cup thinly sliced celery until tender (about 7 minutes). Toss with bread cubes.

Toss in:

Cooked sausage

6 oz mozzarella cut into 1/2 inch cubes

5 oz spicy pepperoni cut into 1/4 inch cubes (optional) Moisten with 1/2 cup of chicken stock.

Bake at 350 for 30 to 45 minutes (until golden brown) This unusual stuffing can be prepared the day before and baked on Thanksgiving
