Chocolate Tossies

Dough:

2 cups flour

½ lb. butter

6 oz. cream cheese

Line tossie pans with dough

Chocolate Filling:

1 cup (6oz.) chocolate chips melted

Add

1/3 cup sugar

1 Tbsp. milk

1 Tbsp. butter

1 Tsp. vanilla

Stir in double boiler. Remove from heat and blend in 1 egg (beaten)

Cream Cheese Filling:

8 oz. cream cheese

1/4 cup sugar

1 egg

1/4 tsp. vanilla

Pour chocolate filling halfway in each tossie cup. Top with spoonful of cream cheese filling and garnish with a chocolate chip. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 to 25 minutes.
