The Easter Lily



The Easter lily is the beautiful trumpetshaped white flower that symbolizes purity, virtue, innocence, hope and life, which is the spiritual essence of Easter.

Dating back to Biblical scriptures, the lily is mentioned numerous times. One of the most famous Biblical references is in the Sermon on the Mount, when Christ told his listeners: "Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they toil not, neither do they spin; and yet... Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these."

Often called the "white-robed apostles of hope, lilies were found growing in the Garden of Gethsemane after Christ's agony. Tradition has it that the beautiful white lilies sprung up where drops of Christ's sweat fell to the ground in his final hours of sorrow. Churches continue this tradition at Easter time by gracing the church and surrounding their crosses with lilies to commemorate the resurrection of Jesus and hope of life everlasting.

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." So

Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. (Jn 20, 1-8)

My Dear Friends,

During this month we will rejoice Christ's Resurrection, but we still have two weeks of Lent ahead. We are still in our journey to the tomb of the Lord. We will run as his disciples did that Easter morning and discover the core of the Christian faith – which is that Jesus suffered, died and resurrected for our Salvation.

Crispy Peanut Butter Easter Eggs

2 cups creamy peanut butter

3/4 cup butter, softened

- 3 1/2 cups confectionary sugar
- 3 cups crispy rice cereal
- 1 (12 oz.) package of semi-sweet or milk chocolate chips
- 2 Tablespoons shortening

In a mixing bowl, combine peanut butter and butter. Stir in sugar and cereal until a dough is formed. Chill for about an hour. Shape mixture into egg shapes and freeze for 20 minutes.

Melt chocolate chips and shortening in a double boiler over low heat. When melted, dip eggs in Chocolate. Place on waxed paper and allow to cool.

Makes about 20 eggs.
