Annual Blessing of Cars and Drivers



St. Christopher is a widely popular saint, especially admired by athletes, mariners, ferrymen, and travelers. He is celebrated as one of the Fourteen Holy Helpers and holds patronage of things related to travel.

According to legend, Christopher was told because of his size and strength he could serve Christ by assisting people to cross a dangerous river, where many were perishing in the attempt. So he became a ferryman, carrying pilgrims on his strong shoulders across a swift-moving river while using a staff to maintain his balance.

One day a young child approached and asked to be ferried across the stream. Halfway across, the weight of the child became so great that he feared they wouldn't make it. When they finally arrived safely on the other side, the child explained that he had been carrying the weight of the sins of the world. Christopher knew then that he had been carrying Christ, and that he'd met the all-powerful God for whom he'd been searching. The name "Christopher" means "Christ-bearer," and he is usually shown supporting the Christ child on his shoulders. This was what made Christopher patron saint of travelers.

Miniature statues are frequently displayed in Automobiles. In French a widespread phrase for such medals is "Regarde St Christophe et va-t-en rassuré" ("Look at St Christopher and go on reassured", sometimes translated as "Behold St Christopher and go your way in safety"); Saint Christopher medals and holy cards in Spanish have the phrase "Si en San Cristóbal confías, de accidente no morirás" ("If you trust St. Christopher, you won't die in an

accident"). In Austria an annual collection for providing vehicles for the use of missionaries is taken up on a Sunday close to the feast of Saint Christopher, asking people to contribute a very small sum of money for every kilometer that they have traveled safely during the year.

St. Christopher's Day is the occasion for the Blessing of the Cars. The custom began in 1933, when the pastor of Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church in Nesquehoning, Pennsylvania started blessing automobiles after he himself had been involved in three serious car accidents.

Heavenly Peanut Butter Pie

CRUST:

2 cups graham cracker crumbs
1/4 cup butter (1/2 stick) melted
2 oz. semi-sweet chocolate, grated

FILLING:

1 cup crunchy peanut butter
1 pkg. (8-oz.) cream cheese, softened
2 teaspoons butter, softened
1 cup sugar
1 teaspoon vanilla
1/2 cup miniature chocolate chips
1/2 cup salted peanuts (optional)
1 pkg. (8-oz.) frozen whipped topping, thawed

In medium bowl, combine cracker crumbs, butter and chocolate; mixed well. Reserve 1/4 cup crumb mixture to use as garnish. Press remaining crumb mixture onto bottom and sides of 9-inch pie plate. Chill.

In large bowl, beat together peanut butter, cream cheese and butter. Add sugar and vanilla; blend well.

Stir in chocolate chips and peanuts. Fold in whipping topping. Pour into chilled crust and garnish with reserved crumb mixture. Chill overnight.
