Easy Apple Bake

2 c. flour

1 tsp. baking powder

1/2 tsp. salt

Combine and set aside.

1 3/4 c. sugar

1 tsp. cinnamon

1 tsp. vanilla

1 c. cooking oil

3 beaten eggs

Combine.

Combine both sets of ingredients until well blended.

Add:

2 c. sliced apples

1 c. chopped nuts

Blend well and turn into greased 9x13 inch pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 35-40 minutes.

Cut into squares when cool.
