Hot Chicken Salad

3 chicken breasts cooked and chopped into small pieces

- 1 cup cooked rice
- 1 can cream of chicken soup
- 1 cup chopped celery

1 cup chopped water chestnuts

3/4 cup mayonnaise



Topping - 1 cup crushed corn flakes, 1/4 lb. melted butter, 1/2 cup slivered almonds

Mix ingredients together and place in ungreased baking dish. Combine toppings and spread over top.

Bake 350 degrees for 35 minutes.
