Old-Fashioned Bean Soup

1lb. (2 cups) Great Northern white beans

2 smoked ham hocks (21/2 lb.)

1 cup finely chopped onion

2 cloves garlic, crushed

1 bay leaf

1 cup mashed potato

1 cup sliced celery

1 cup thinly sliced carrot


1 teaspoon salt

1/8 teaspoon pepper

2 tablespoons chopped parsley

- 1. Wash beans. Cover with 21/2 quarts water; refrigerate, covered, overnight.
- 2. Next day, turn beans and water (there should be 6 cups) into 6-quart kettle.
- 3. Add ham hocks, onion, garlic and bay leaf. Bring to boiling; reduce heat, and simmer, covered tightly, about 2 hours, or until beans are almost tender.
- 4. Add mashed potato, celery, carrot, salt and pepper. Return to boiling; simmer, covered, about 1 hour longer, or until beans are tender.
- 5. Remove ham hocks; cut off meat. Dice meat and return to kettle. Before serving, sprinkle with parsley.

Note: Use leftover mashed potato, or make from instant.
