Saint Sebastian



Sebastian was a Roman soldier with a deadly secret, he was a Christian. He was actually a double agent. He

lived at a time when the emperor, Diocletian, was persecuting Christians. While he appeared to be one of the emperor's loyal guards, secretly he was comforting Christian prisoners and converting prison guards.

When the emperor discovered Sebastian's true faith, Diocletian was furious and ordered him to be shot with arrows. The execution was carried out and Sebastian was left for dead, but a woman named Irene found him still alive and nursed him back to health.

With great courage Sebastian returned to the emperor and protested against his cruelty. Diocletian ordered him to be clubbed to death. This time he died of his wounds. A church now stands on the spot outside Rome, Italy, where he is believed to be buried.

St. Sebastian's Feast Day is January 20. He has become the Patron Saint of Archers, Athletes and Soldiers.

Easy Parm Garlic Chicken



• 1/2 cup Grated Parmesan Cheese

• 1 envelope Good Seasons Italian Salad Dressing and Recipe Mix

- 1/2 tsp. garlic powder
- 6 boneless skinless chicken breast halves (about 2 lbs.)

1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Mix cheese, salad dressing mix and garlic powder.
